Foster Parent Highlight - Chloe Ciferri

What inspired you to become a foster parent?

Our journey to fostering began after the loss of our daughter, Addie. In the deep grief that followed, my heart kept pulling toward the idea of opening our home to a child who needed one. I wanted to mother in a new way—to give love, stability, and family to a child who might not otherwise have it. Fostering felt like a way to honor Addie's life while helping another family and child.

How long have you been fostering, and how many children have you fostered?

We began fostering in 2018 and have had the privilege of fostering 2 children, and adopting TJ, the first kiddo to enter our home.

What was your first placement like, and what did you learn from that experience?

Our first placement (now our son, TJ) was overwhelming and beautiful all at once. You open the doors thinking you're prepared, and in many ways, you are, but nothing compares to the moment a child walks into your home and says, "are you my mommy?" I learned that love grows quickly, that grief and hope can exist at the same time, and that saying goodbye (if and when it happens) is both heartbreaking and hopeful.

Can you share a memorable moment that made you feel proud to be a foster parent?

Finalizing TJ's adoption will always be one of the proudest, most emotional moments of my life. To know that he is safe, loved, and our son forever, it's hard to put into words. It wasn't just a legal process, it was the moment we became a forever family.

How has fostering impacted your family?

It's expanded our hearts and our understanding of love. We've have gained an entire family through our son, that we never would have. We've learned that family isn't always defined by blood, but by commitment, support, and love. Fostering has made us stronger and more deeply connected to one another. It has allowed us to have honest conversations with our kids, even though they are still very young.

What has been the most rewarding part of being a foster parent?

The most rewarding part has been watching love rewrite someone's story. Seeing our son go from uncertainty to security, from surviving to thriving, is a gift I will never stop being grateful for. It's in the little moments—the way he reaches for my hand without hesitation, the pride in his smile, the peace in his sleep. Knowing I get to be his safe place, his forever, is the greatest reward of all.

How has CONCERN supported you throughout your journey?

CONCERN has been an incredible partner throughout our journey. From day one, they've been there with guidance, encouragement, and practical support. I never felt like I was doing this alone—they truly care about both the children and the families who decide to foster.


One of my favorite researchers and motivational speakers is Dr. Brené Brown. She once said:




